I liked the topics. The facilitators sometimes need to cut the conversations when it becomes circular. The group is cool to know.

I liked each one of the group. I didn't have any plans for the group before and I feel good with everyone. I wish everyone a nice stay at the volunteer placements. Never experienced translation going on like this. Thanks, you did a great job.

Sorry for not being able to speak English. It is good to be part of this project. I am happy to get to know everyone and spend time with all, to hear from everyone about their life, how it is for them. I liked it when we talked in little groups, for me it was really new. There are a lot of nice girls here. Thanks for helping me when I didn't understand something.

He explained the fact why the Roma are still where they are, we got the reasons.



I had fears before coming here. It is my 1st seminar like this, though I am a teacher. You all do good in your placements and you step for values that are great human values, we are stepping forward. I am thankful that everyone came to participate. I will take home some warmth with me. It is a big impulse for me to continue.

I am happy for the group, seeing a group so diverse and yet working and communication so good with each other. I am also glad that everyone was sharing and gave their inputs during the different sessions.



It is good to get together with other people who are excited about Roma issues. People at my placement are not like this. I felt support in a group like this. The seminar location is not the perfect one for an event like this. Amaro Drom could have done a presentation about the Roma population here to get a better idea about Berlin. More breaks would have been good. The RGDTS café was great and the Speed-dating, would be great to have a guided discussion afterwards the next time.

Maybe next time would be good that the hosting organization of the seminar brings other organizations that do Roma stuff. I made good relationships with a lot of people.
